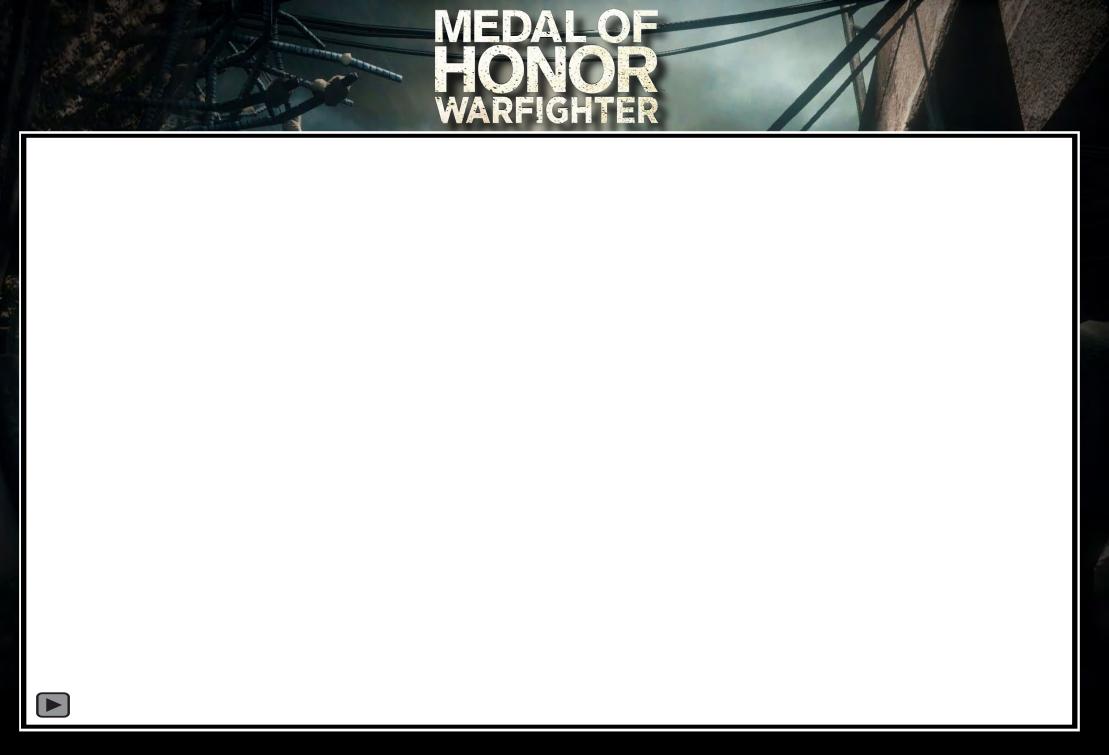

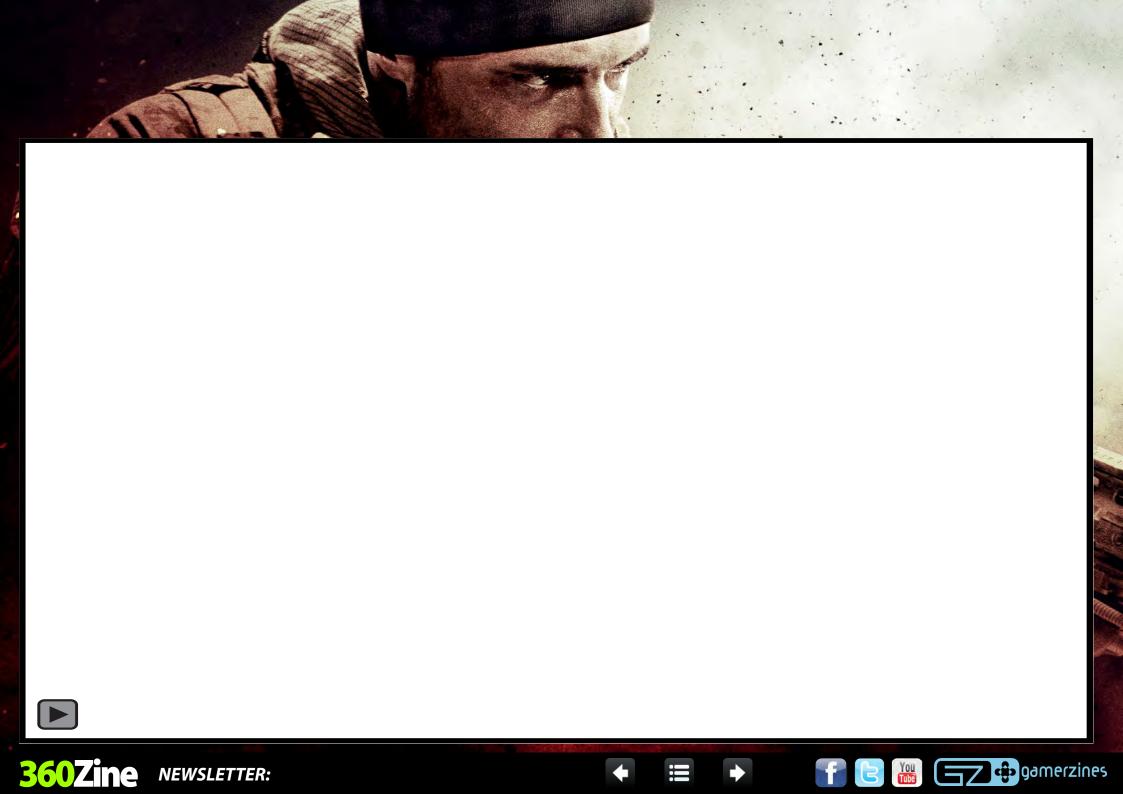

Going overboard

ou might think you know everything about Assassin's *Creed III.* You're probably already familiar with Connor Kenway, the half-Native American, half-British star of the third chapter in the series' epic saga, picking up the gauntlet from Italian assassin Ezio Auditore's overstayed welcome. You're probably clued up on the game's 18th Century backdrop, one that will see Kenway intervening in the American Revolution over the span of 30 years, taking out key figures in the conflict and storming battlefields that promise to be a

thousand soldiers strong.

You've probably been wowed by the technical wonders of the AnvilNext engine, the behemoth that's powering the American Frontier to allow dynamic believable weather, scale realistic terrain and trees while scouting the wildlife that inhabit the area, and dive through buildings rather than climb to their peaks. But Ubisoft would have been foolish to play all their cards upfront and the latest reveal for the highly anticipated third title is quite a departure for a series that's built its foundations on killing quietly.

Removing the iconic hood and popping on a tricorn hat, Connor will take a break from trawling through snow to soak up some sun, sailing the seas of the Caribbean in the latter half of the war.

It's a side quest of Assassin's Creed III but a substantial one. Just 'three to four' ship battles will be shoehorned into the game's 30hour campaign but there's plenty more to be enjoyed for those looking to stretch their sea legs.

You'll start with a standard vessel and with some plain ol' cannon balls as your weapon to attack with. As you progress though, you'll unlock economic rewards and ship upgrades that bolster your defences with hull upgrades. A regular cannon ball will damage a ship but a chain shot will tear up an enemy's mast making them immobile. And a grape shot, a shotgun-like blast made up of the ships debris, inflicts massive damage.

As Master and Commander, Connor can leave his post to scout the seas, peering through his telescope from the deck or atop a sail. At the helm, you'll have direct control of both your vessel and its artillery, aiming your assaults across stretches of water.

Missions are stretched between navigating enemy seas rife with mines, attacking forts accessible only by the water, and waging epic wars at sea. If a Templar is onboard an enemy vessel, Connor will need to employ chain shots to break an enemy's masts allowing your ship to get close enough to it that Kenway and his crew may leap aboard it. Once onboard its standard *Assassin's Creed* combat but not without a few new touches. Connor's dual-wielding technique allows him to kill opposing crew using gruesome combos his pistols, though limited in use, allow him to shoot gun powder blowing it up.

2011's *Revelations* introduced a somewhat lacklustre tower defence side quest that is, from what we can tell, absent from *Assassin's Creed III*. Despite going against the nature of the series' lone survivor approach, naval combat feels like a surprisingly good fit. ROLL

eveloped using DICE's Frostbite 2 engine, Danger Close Games has chosen to take *Medal of Honor: Warfighter's* multiplayer into its own hands. 12 playable Tier 1 special forces from 10 countries will be selectable in multiplayer, each with their own weapons, tactics and special abilities to boot. These cover your typical military shooter classes, ranging from the all-rounder the Polish GROM ops, to snipers, heavies, stealthy types and so on.

What's interesting is the ability to mix these up in Fire Teams, where up to two players of different classes can share a health bar and ammo while earning extra XP for working together and looking out for one another. If one member of the unit is shot down, you can revive them by taking out the soldier in question.

Bolstering this new multiplayer set-up will be new maps based on real-world locations, including Bosnian capital Sarajevo, The Philippines and Bosnia. New multiplayer modes also include Home Run, a tense variation of Protect the Flag in which respawns are removed entirely. One life and you're done. It might sound harsh but ultimately, Danger Close should be able to pride itself on *Warfighter*'s realistic strengths when it goes head-to-head with *Halo* and *Call of Duty* this holiday.

Much like the Autolog that debuted in 2010's *Hot Pursuit, Most Wanted* introduces non-stop multiplayer elements that keep you clued up on all your friends' latest top scores. Multiplayer is governed by Speed Points that you'll earn for every race and every challenge you win or beat.

One such example is the Speedtest event, where racers are challenged to clock the fastest time on a speed camera within 90 seconds. If you win, other players will see your face whenever they drive past. There's also CloudCompete, a new cloud-based save system that'll allow you to pick up your *Most Wanted* progress stats on your phone, PC or on your PlayStation 3.

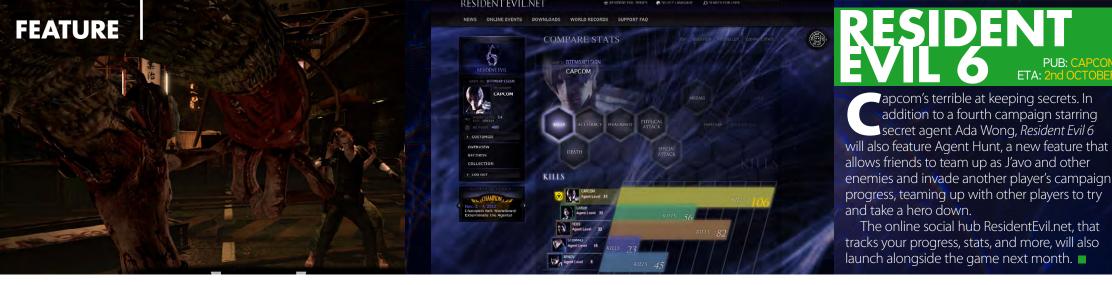

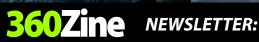

Falling with style

or what seems like the first time since the days of the Mega Drive, popular comicbook and film licenses are actually turning out some good games. Much of that can be put down to Rocksteady's stellar efforts on both recent Batman games that served up a firm boot up the behind the industry's lacking standards. With a slew of Transformers games already under its belt, High Moon Studios' Fall of Cybertron is by far its best if not a somewhat forgettable experience.

Picking up after 2010's War for Cybertron, both Autobots and Decepticons are battling it out to save home planet Cybertron. There's a noticeably darker, more story-driven direction in FoC although it's hard to get caught up in the melodrama of this robot opera.

13 campaign missions jump from bot to bot, putting you in control of a great many fan favourites such as Optimus Prime and Jazz, and even a few baddies including Megatron and Starscream. With each new bot comes a new ability – Jazz's hookshot allowing him to reach distant platforms and yank doors from their housings whereas Starscream is able to cloak himself with invisibility for short periods of time. The result is a handful of levels that are crafted with these mechanics in mind. Vortex's aerial

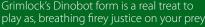

metal works and strafing to blitzkrieg an Autobot stronghold. Though the idea of playing hide and seek as a large hunk of metal is laughable, it all comes as a welcome change of pace to the game's largely battlefield-driven scuffles interspersed with brief vehicular segments.

Gunplay is passable, even in a post-Binary Domain world, but the lack of a cover system leaves you peering around walls and taking shots from afar, with close confrontations avoided unless you've got the weapon to back it up. Speaking of weapons, you'll pull the trigger and aim down the sights of a number of weapons big and small all upgradable by forking out your hard earned Energon shard at Teletrean 1 terminals.

It's a campaign that's rife with a level of spectacle and explosion seen in the recent smattering of silverscreen blockbusters but in FoC it gives way to some fantastic set-pieces. You'll toy around with Metroplex, Optimus' towering remote control

giant and piloting Grimlock in his fire-breathing Dinobot form.

Even in its smallest details – the seamless transition from bot to vehicle, a maze that transforms as you delve deeper into it, corridors that open up into gigantic open areas - it appears High Moon's efforts have ramped up considerably since WfC.

Outside of the 10-hour campaign, co-operative play has been culled in favour of Escalation, a Gears of War-borrowed Horde mode pitting four-players against 15 waves of metallic perils with loot drops and gunships assisting as the difficulty ramps up. Multiplayer is an equally uninspired but standard affair with Deathmatch and Capture the Flag modes ticking the boxes but the option to build your own Transforming bot should draw in a few punters.

FoC sees High Moon Studios deliver a solid effort, a labour of love, and something that's bound to please fans of the franchise. Others will find it be a mostly derivative collage of play styles



that keeps the campaign fresh but lacks memorability. Another licensed game that's more than 'just decent' but falls short of inspirational.

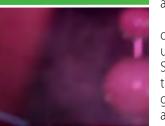

SLEEPING DOGS

Seeping Dogs is a Grand Theft Auto clone through and through, and that's no bad thing. From its open-world playground to its cinematic homages, Rockstar's tried and tested formula has been followed to a tee but Sleeping Dogs emerges from its troubled development history with a few merits of its own.

Sent to investigate the murky depths of Hong Kong's criminal underbelly, undercover cop Wei Shen has to assimilate himself into the Triad gang The Sun On Yee to gain notoriety driving fast and kicking ass. Missions are split into three

categories: triad, cop, and face – the latter improving Wei's street cred through favours, street races and other smaller tasks that in turn allow Wei to sport nicer bling and rides and earn neat bonuses such as shopping discounts and even a personal valet.

Cop missions are a little further off the beaten track, *L.A. Noire*-style investigations that see Wei playing dress-up, and drug busts that have Wei whipping out his smartphone to hack cameras and pick locks. However, Wei's police training is better served in *Sleeping Dogs*' Triad missions that play out in

elaborate displays similar to that of Hong Kong cinema, and that see Wei beating down thugs, chasing suspects through bustling markets, and leaping out of his car to be behind the wheel of another in a matter of seconds.

The sparing use of guns and explosions give way to Wei's profound martial art abilities to roundhouse ruffians and counter incoming attacks through a *Batman*-inspired combat system. Wei's surroundings also serve him a great aid in combat, providing a range of dumpsters, meat hooks, table saws and perfectly arranged swordfish heads for players to fling, skewer, shred and kebab thugs onto, in a satisfying displays that will have onlookers wincing.

Likewise, *Sleeping Dogs'* arcadey driving makes for some satisfying trips about town. The selection is strictly limited to cars, bikes and the occasional boat ride but each handle perfectly, allowing you to take sharp corners without spinning out, and the ability to shunt sideways into your opponents makes for some brilliant chase sequences.

Hong Kong itself is split into four largely discernible districts but each densely populated with commuters, locals peddling their wares, and attractions including karaoke bars,









street races, and cockfights around each and every corner.

Though it lacks any significant landmarks, Hong Kong is littered with enough distractions to pull Wei away from his duties with lockboxes, health shrines, and drug busts providing enough cause for an impromptu detour. Even if you don't want to give in to those childish urges, you can always rugby tackle a hooker in the street and break her leg before stuffing her in the boot of your car and driving her off a cliff, leaping out just in time to shoot up the engine – you know, if you *have* to...

Sleeping Dogs' only shortcoming is its story which, despite a handful of thrilling set-pieces and a roster of well-voiced roles that often slip into its native tongue, is an unsurprisingly and awkwardly paced tale as we watch Wei's moral compass spin faster than his cyclone kicks.

It's also a little shorter than expected. Those who choose to rush through the game's 30 or so story missions could blitz the campaign in about 10 hours, although that amount is easily doubled if you plan on making the most out of your Hong Kong visit and beating friend's records on the in-game scoreboards.

Though its story might not match up to the quality of Rockstar's fiction, *Sleeping Dogs* introduces systems and mechanics that make each punch up and car journey as satisfying as the last. A troubled development cycle has earned *Sleeping Dogs* a few cuts and bruises along the way but as far as *GTA* clones go you'll be hard pressed to find one much better than this. ■

Armed with an Interdimensional Shift Device that allows players to transform their surroundings, turning regular rooms into fluffy playgrounds where heavy objects are as light as a feather or a dimension where gravity works in reverse sending anything that isn't nailed to the floor hurtling towards the ceiling. It hits all the same highs of Portal's eureka moments and it's a far more colourful setting than Aperture's labs, too. Still, those looking for something a little cerebral shouldn't have trouble

loving Quantum Conundrum, even if it falls short of Valve's watermark.

Got this one covered?

iven that 5th Cell's last title was the ingenious Scribblenauts, Hybrid seems like an unlikely next step – at first glance at least. A cover shooter that takes the term very seriously, Hybrid looks like your typical thirdperson shooter brightened up by an uninspiring future tech setting.

An online-only shooter centering round a war for the Earth's limited resources between the Variants and the Paladins, Hybrid thrusts you into close-quarters encounters in deathmatch and team-based modes across 10 maps.

The twist is that players aren't given the typical freedom to dash around battlegrounds but instead move from cover to cover by selecting their next cover

spot and flying over to it. It's unconventional for the genre but it's a clever way of making you question every move around each battlefield.

It's also deeply customisable too, with fine-tuned loadouts and perks for racking up kills, which include bots that'll assist you in spotting and taking down enemies and an assassin who will dash across cover to earn vou a one-hit kill.

Looks can be deceiving but Hybrid is actually a very intriguing shooter with a slick learning curve and a neat hook. It's not going to overthrow the Call of Duty's and Halo's for Xbox Live dominance

but few Arcade offerings come quite as close.

Like you do.

Arming the ballista is a tedious process: stepping forward and making a grabbing motion before stepping back to aim your shot and spreading your arms out to release your artillery. Depending on vour choice of weapon, vou'll be

It'll scratch your destructive itch for a short time but Wreckateer is more likely to have the kids occupied for longer than you.

Tales don't tell themselves

ust: An Elysian Tail is a beautiful game. From its titular star's fluid combat animations to the luscious handdrawn background and dynamic weather effects, it's hard not to admit that this is one of the most attractive-looking Xbox Live Arcade titles we've seen in a good while.

Yet those who choose to actually play the game will find even more to salivate about from this slice of Metroidvania. Combat. for example, is just as satisfying with fairy sidekick Fidget dishing out magic attacks that Dust can whip up into storms using his dust storm move, and his aerial attacks never fail to rack up a sizeable hit counter in the hundreds. Enemies are never overly difficulty but their strength in numbers approach can make keeping track of them a little difficult, resulting in some

infuriating combo breaks.

RPG elements are light with side quests filling in your spare time and levelling up, item management and chest hunting all regular distractions.

It's a shame the story should be the game's underlying weakness – Dust himself being a victim of memory loss led into an adventure by a irritating fairy and a talking sword. Even their cute and colourful anthropomorphic ways do little to convince you of their troubles and hardships.

But what it lacks in a paltry story it more than makes up for with its exaggerated displays, noteworthy visuals and a soundtrack that's always ready to illuminate Dust's adventure. For its strengths alone,

Dust should have no trouble finding its audience.
