WHAT'S THE STORY?

It's back to the drawing board for Sega, as they continue their quest to make a Sonic game that is as exciting and fun to play as the original Sonic games on the Mega Drive console were.

WHAT DO WE KNOW SO FAR?

As well as a mixture of 2D and 3D sections (see the 'Best Bits' box on the right), the game will also be split into two very different parts. In the daylight,

Sonic will be the usual speed freak that we know and love, but when darkness falls he transforms into a Werehog, and it's the gameplay that'll transform too, into a slower, more traditional platformer. So far, so new...

COULD IT BE SPECIAL?

Definitely. The original Sonic Team are working around the clock to make this the most gorgeous looking and playable Sonic game we've ever seen. And, so far, the signs are looking pretty darned promising.

SO, ANYTHING ELSE?

There will be nine massive levels to the game, all of which will be based on real-world locations like Greece and New York. Oh, and old favourite characters like Tails, Amy, Knuckles and Shadow are promised to make an appearance – although that may only be for the game's multiplayer minigames. This could be very big, folks! 👾





Definitely the most interesting aspect of the game is the 'Hedgehog Engine', which will flip the action from 3D to 2D seamlessly. This means that fans of the original Sonic games (and there are a few of em!) can finally have a Sonic game that will be as fast and frantic as the originals.

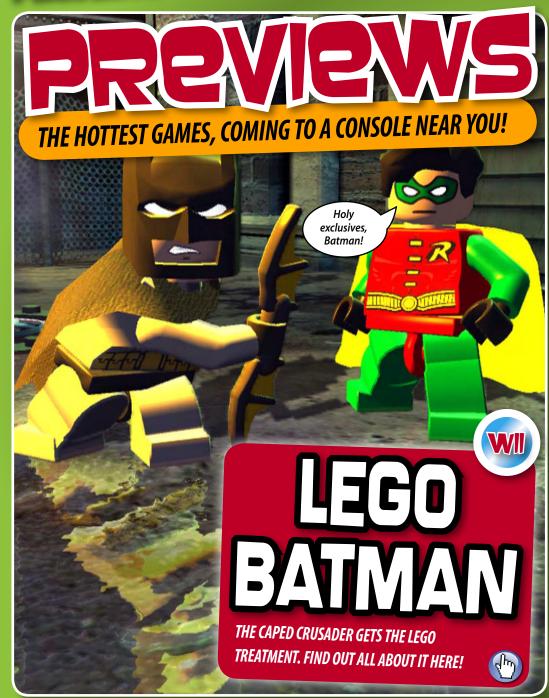

A block-buster in every sense

The art style is more colourful than The Dark Knight. It copies the early TV show and comic books rather than the newer films.

here's something really satisfying about smashing apart the objects that litter LEGO Batman's levels, and seeing masses of studs spill outwards, making that gorgeous tinkling sound as you collect them all up, ready to unlock one of the wealth of secret characters, cheats or other surprises on offer. Yep, LEGO Batman offers plenty of the comforting

familiarity of the previous LEGO games, but there's a host of new stuff that just might make this the best bricksmacking, baddie-whacking LEGO game to date.

Traveller's Tales have created their own story for the game - and it's full of daft jokes and moments which

make it the funniest LEGO game vet.

BLOCK PARTY

The odd few pointer-based bits aside, there's not much to write home about by way of special Wii controls, unless you count the noises coming out of the Remote's speaker (which every game and its dog is doing these days). No, the innovations in LEGO Batman are all in the gameplay. While LEGO

Indiana Jones offered more exploration and puzzle solving than flat-out action, Batman blends that with Star Wars' faster pace to make for a really well-balanced game that has arguably the perfect mix of scrapping and thinking.

As the dynamic duo don't really have any superpowers, they've been given special tech suits which allow each to solve individual puzzles. At one point we needed Batman's special suit to swoop over a large gaps to operate a bridge and bring Robin over, who used his magnetic boots to climb up a vertical structure to an unreachable



DS ALSO ON DS

We spent some time with the DS version, which is surprisingly similar to its big brother – stylus controls are mainly restricted to lever-flicking or item-shifting, but the buttons do the job just fine. A vertically scrolling Batmobile chase we tried worked very well, while the character customiser had us creating some truly bizarre - and hilarious - people.

Melee combat is shallow but cool. There's nothing quite like seeing an enemy's head fly off after a powerful

bat-punch!

area. And some puzzles are made for two – as with previous LEGO games, it's more fun with someone sitting next to you, but Traveller's Tales have taken advantage of this, with a couple of sections we saw requiring both players to co-operate simultaneously.

TURN TO THE DARK SIDE

But the Hero side is only half the game. You can also play as the villains too, and by the time you've finished the game you'll be astonished at the range to choose from. Most enemies have their own unique powers – a few are basic re-skins, but many have specific puzzles only they can tackle. Some of the powers are fairly obvious, but other baddies have surprise abilities. Did you

know the Joker could wield two Uzis so effectively? No, neither did we, and his electric hand-buzzer (collapsing any unfortunate victims into tiny Lego pieces) had us chuckling away merrily as we used it on several of Commissioner Gordon's men.

The lack of a single licence – it's not based on The Dark Knight, but includes elements of all versions of Batman past, from the comics through the

Time for a Bat-chat!

f you really want to know about the game and how it was made, then who do you ask? The developers of course, so it's time to find out the whole story...

Is LEGO Batman based on a particular film, TV show or comic?

It has been exciting for us, as it has been the first time that we have created an original story and not been tied to any of the previous films. In our story, all the villains have broken out of the asylum and they are running amok in Gotham, creating lots of mischief. The great thing about LEGO Batman is that you can play it from the other way around. If you are feeling a bit naughty, you can explore your darker side and play as the villains from their perspective.

What abilities and gadgets will Batman and Robin have?

Batman and Robin will each have four suits including their classic outfits. They will be able to

utilise these to enhance their abilities or to access new areas in the game. So for example, Robin has

these funky magno boots, which will enable him to walk vertically or even upside down on metal surfaces. So you might need Robin to access various areas. Batman has a demo suit that enables him to drop Bat

camp Sixties TV series to Tim Burton's efforts – means Traveller's Tales have been able to invent their own script. And the reins have come off

completely, with references and silly jokes galore, along with a few elements that you really wouldn't expect to see in a Batman game. For example, you can create a giant turtle to ride through one stage.

OVER AND OVER

With all these different abilities on offer, the levels have much more

replay value than ever before, with various areas only available to certain characters (like previous LEGO games), and the number and quality of the unlockables makes going back more worthwhile. In other words, you really do get plenty of bang for your buck here. So Bat fans, join us next month; same Bat-time, same Bat-channel for our review. 🙀

LEGO Batman is more actionpacked than previous games as you're playing as Batman and Robin who are martial artists, so there's lots more hand-to-hand combat. Playing in Villain mode is also something really unique to this game. 🙀

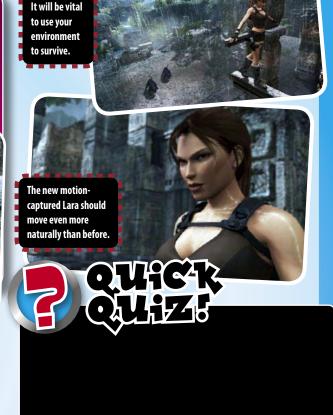

onsidering it's nearly a decade old (which is staggering to believe, but also true. Honest), Sega's stunningly addictive rhythm action title Samba de Amigo is still amazingly playable, both in its arcade and Dreamcast (remember those?) versions. However, a bit of progress is never a bad thing really, and this Wii version basically takes the 1999 original and gives it a bit of spit and polish.

There are more songs, more options and generally there's much more music-related tomfoolery to indulge in - oh, and better graphics, natch.

Using the Wii Remote and Nunchuk controllers to replicate the maracas of the original game, the general aim is to shake your hands in time with the pumping soundtrack. It sounds dead easy on paper but when you consider that you have to shake high or low,

depending on the on-screen instructions, things can get tricky fairly swiftly – some of the faster songs will have you striking all kinds of hilarious poses as you attempt to keep up with each song. Without a doubt, this is a great game to play with mates.

There's going to be over 40 songs included from the off, but Sega has promised that downloadable 'Song Packs' will be made available too, with the first one coming out as soon as the game hits the shelves. Potentially then, there's no limit to the amount of fun this game can offer. Review next month. 👾

Action, adventure and acrobatics, as the Prince goes portable!

iven the success of the recent three-dimensional wall-running, enemy-slicing adventures, it's almost strange to think of the Prince of Persia's 2D platforming origins. But while this DS game looks fairly true to the game's roots – while also tying in nicely with the forthcoming 'illustrative' style series reboot – the Prince's portable quest has a few neat tricks of its own to stand out from its rivals.

For starters, there's the 'chibi' character model – the Prince looking a little more squat (and, we admit, cuter) than on the bigger consoles. Then there's the unusual control scheme rather than traditional button controls, the Prince's actions will be mainly stylus-focused – taps and slides guiding him easily around all of the different levels and stages (over 50 are promised for the finished game). You'll

also get to control an additional character – the mysterious Magus – whose magic helps our hero through plenty of tight spots. Squeezing the L trigger will allow you to use his powers to drag obstacles or cast spells.

With such a unique way of moving the Prince and his new assistant, Prince of Persia will likely feel very different from any other game in the series so far. Whether the touchscreen controls

Is it a birdie or a bogey for this king of the swingers?

ne of the problems with golf games is the same problem that cricket, baseball and snooker games all share... no matter how good the graphics and gameplay, they never quite work, and for the simple reason that you miss the physical side of the game. That problem is now solved with the Wii and Tiger Woods PGA Tour 09, a game that recreates golf about as well as you can possibly imagine.

Swinging with a Wii Remote was definitely fun in last year's game, but it's been improved loads in this update, with a sensitivity that means all you have to do is swing the Remote a tiny amount for it to register with your onscreen character. This means that those dangerous tiny chips from the fairway onto the green are now both incredibly straightforward to do and also enormously satisfying at the same time.

There's much more in this year's game, though. The game's subtitle is 'All-Play', and this is added because of the new All-Play swing system.

Designed to make taking shots even easier, it shows the direction your shot will take with an arc that curves up from the point your ball is to where it will land. You can even add slice to the ball too, but this does of course make the game much easier to play.

We managed to get a chip in off the edge of the green and sink the ball into the pin with a shot of just over 20 yards! Your challenge, if you choose to accept it, is to do better than that. It sounds hard, but isn't impossible. Aim carefully and use the perfect amount of strength and you can do it too!





Finally, you've got the Party Games, which is a ton of fun in the shape of a load of mini-games that have you kart racing and bouncing balls off a club head. Best of all is the Ball Battle option, which allows you and your opponents to alter the course of the ball with the Wii Remote by clicking on it and dragging your hand away from the ball.

THE KING OF CLUBS

All these extra features wouldn't make a load of difference if the gameplay behind it all wasn't up to it, though.

Thankfully, that's as solid as ever. With three choices of swing to choose from, intelligent controls, improved graphics and updating (everything now runs at a super-smooth 30 frames per second. Nice), a whole range of tournaments and modes to play with and, finally, an even better character creation system that'll let you recreate your own features with amazing accuracy. Add all that lot together and you've got a golf game that's almost an essential purchase. 👾

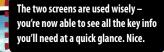

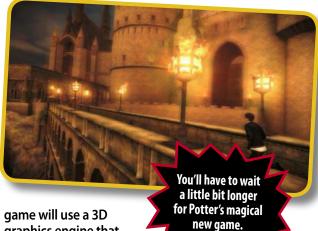

Your perfect guide to staying out of the rough

Putting can be tricky, but keep an eye on the lines on the green and that will help.





BLOWN AWAY

The main factor that will affect the direction of your shot is the wind. Look for the indicator in the top left-hand corner of the screen and that gives you an arrow showing the direction of the wind and a number for its strength anything over 10 is pretty serious. Make sure you take this into account when lining up your shot.

EATING YOUR GREENS

One of the hardest parts of the game is putting out. It's pretty easy to get to a green in two shots (even on a Par 5), but you can waste a load of shots trying to get the ball in the hole! Look

at the colours of the grid (which go from green for a gentle slop to red for an extreme one) and also the pointers moving along the lines – the faster they're moving, the greater the slope.

TAKE TO THE SKIES

We suggest that you do a fly-by of your shot before you take each one. Press and hold down the A button and your view will head straight up and along the hole until you reach the ball's landing spot. Not only does this give you an excellent perspective on where the flag is, but it'll also show you where the ball is expected to land if you hit the ball with maximum strength.

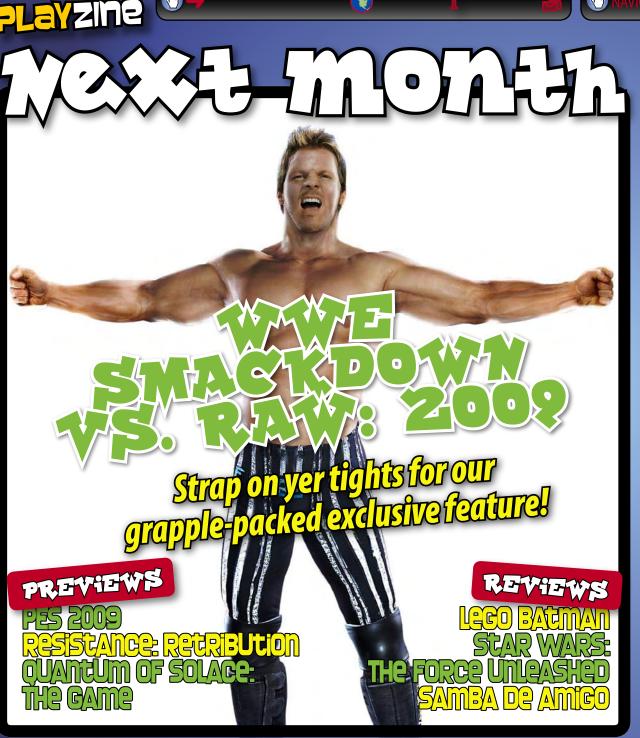
