





FIN IN THE SIN?



Well, here we are. Summer is almost upon us and yet the arrival of games remains as a trickle. Perhaps we might have expected things to have picked up a bit by now but it just ain't happening. This certainly isn't the end. Recently we've heard rumblings of a DKC sequel and a new Mario title in the pipeline but that doesn't exactly constitute an opening of the flood gates.

So what is the reason for all this lack of activity? The SNES certainly isn't being phased out yet. And as for the Gameboy, well, GB owners have never had it so good. Okay, maybe that's a slight exag-

geration, but there are so many big titles around at the moment it's unreal. PGA Euro, Jungle Strike, True Lies and Earthworm

Perhaps one of the most disappointing things about shortage of quality titles is that, as a result, sometimes the software boys deem it necessary to release something in the meantime and the games we do get during these prolonged lulls can be rather second-rate. Now I'm sure that marketing departments across the industry would take issue with that, but then you wouldn't really expect them to react any differently. It's one of those hunches you get, but you have no way of finding any evidence to prove your argu-

Fever Pitch is perhaps one such title, reviewed this issue. There's been a great deal of hype but not much to back it up.

Maybe the lull has something to do with

Nintendo's temporary preoccupation with the first official unveiling of that old chestnut the Ultra 64. Alright, alright, calm down. Before you all go dashing, hammers in hand, in the direction of apprehensive looking piggy banks, this doesn't mean an earlier release for the machine over here. The show is the Electronic Entertainment Expo, or E3, making its debut in Los Angeles. In fact it will have been and gone by the time you read this, but already it promises to be the biggest trade show ever. Hopes for it are so high that the organisers are already planning to bring the event over here, or at least over to Europe, for next year to challenge the established ECTS spring and autumn exhibitions. How it will fair remains to be seen, but has already overhauled the Chicago CES after that show had been the premier event of its kind of a

decade. But back to the Ultra 64.



The launch, if that's what it is, has fuelled the appeals of retailers and management over here to get the thing out before Christmas. With the Sega Saturn, PlayStation and Jaguar all already available albeit only on import in some cases, it means Nintendo are the last major hardware producer to play their hand with reference to the next generation.

One wonders whether they are attempting to reaffirm their status as the most powerful players in the industry by steadfastly refusing to be pushed into anything by any outside influences. They must be careful that things aren't delayed for too long however, or by the time the damn thing sees the light of day everyone will be so sick of the (lack of) sight of it that nobody will bother. Make of it what you will, but they're treading a very precarious path if you ask





STRIKE THREE you're outta here!

The first thing to do is buy a couple of cheap and cheerful rides to get yourself started. A bouncy castle and maybe a ghost train. Pump some money into research however and you'll soon develop more exciting attractions like log flumes and roller coasters. Most rides consist of a single, selfcontained unit which you drop in wherever you want but with the bigger ones, like the go-karts, you can design your own tracks in

much the same way as you laying paths. Click on the track icon then drag the cursor where you want the track to go. With the rollercoaster you have the additional option of going up and down as well as round and round, so make sure you put plenty of loops and

plummeting ramps to reunite the little people with their lunch.

Of course the brasher rides cost big bucks so somewhere along the line you need to raise some cash. Gate receipts won't be that great at first but there are other more subtle ways to rip off the unsuspecting punter. Setting up burger bars and drinks stands helps generate funds, but how

about this for underhand? Increase the amount of salt in the fries and the visitors will get extra thirsty, causing them to buy more drinks. Or howzabout tonking up the caffeine levels in your coffee? This sends all the little peeps hyper. causing them to go on more of you rides and therefore increasing the satisfaction value of your park. Why is this important? I'll tell you.

At the end of each year all the worlds parks are rated in series of league tables for everything from size to excitement value. You're not a monopoly you know. You're up against some pretty stiff competitions from many other theme parks all over the world. As the only land you can afford at the beginning of the game is in England you're at a bit of a disadvantage. After all there's 50 million people in this country compared with say China which has over a billion! The answer — sell up and move on. At the end of the year your park is given a financial value and your then given the opportunity to auction it off, generating funds to buy new land in more lucrative areas of the globe.

Remember — the bigger the potential clientele the more money, the more money the better the park, the better the park the more punters, and the more punters the more

But back to the most important part — the suckers who pays their money. You can watch them wandering around the park, going on rides, getting lost etc. However every now and then a thought bubble appears above their heads indicating how they feel. Hungry, tired, happy or whatever. It's from thoughts that you determine what

are happy about and those which are causing consternation. It's sounds really sad, but you actually find yourself getting involved with the visitors to your park (oo-er). No. it's not what you think. From the tee-off PGA startles with its wide choice off variety. Not only can you play on four different and wonderfully detailed courses, you can choose from four of the worlds top stars; Roger Davies (never heard of him - ed),





Bernhard Langer (who?), Sandy Lyle (Hmm?) and someone else who's so famous I can't remember his name. Still, these players offer a good challenge in the skins tournament and although they're not officially ranked in any order, some are better than others, which gives you, in effect, four different levels you can play.

If winning up to £200,000 in just over an hour doesn't appeal to you though, there's the full-blown tournament event. Spread over four days, you must battle against dozens of Europe's top golfers in an effort to first make the cut, and then, with any luck, go on to finish in the money. This ain't easy though, and it's advisable to first hone your skills on the practice course. Here you can master all those awkward putts, chips and bunker shots.

Before you tee-off for the first time, whether it be in the blazing heat of







Valderamma, or the snowy peaks of Crans Sur Pierre, you get to choose your clubs. These are the important thingys you hit the ball with. Now, if you want to be a John Daley and whack the ball as far as poss, you can choose the power clubs. The more refined player might opt for the skill clubs, while Mr Dull might go for the normal set. Whatever you choose, each set has a dramatic effect on how you play. Power clubs allow you to hit the ball further (increasing the chance of getting a birdie), but controlling the direction is hard, whereas skill clubs do exactly the opposite. The benefit of each set is pretty clear and it will allow you to choose a set that best suits your style and the course your playing on. It also adds a strategical element to the game.

When playing *PGA*, one of the first noticeable things is how empty the screen appears. I mean, where's all the dials and controls that other games completely baffle you with? Thankfully they're not here, instead everything has been kept nice and simple to maximize playability. Selecting clubs is generally done automatically, with a simple tap on the joypad being enough to change if you feel the need. Hitting the ball is also easy, you just aim a little cursor in the direction you want to go (after taking into account the wind) then press the button. A bar then starts to go up to 100% and you hit the button and the percentage you want. The tricky part is when the bar then comes back down and you have to hit the button dead on zero. If you don't, the ball will slice, or hook and go

spinning off in the wrong direction. Mastering this, along with learning to read the wind, is the hardest things to *PGA*, but neither takes too long to figure out, (although the odd slipup is inevitable and will leave you cursing as the ball heads straight for a bunker).



As you can no doubt imagine, platforms rule the roost for the majority of the game though there is a puzzling element in there. Don't think it's a Brain of Britain thing though — the problems are simple at best, downright insulting to the intelligencia at times. Still, it gives your

She can charm even the nastiest looking rotters with a pucker of her lips to stay out of the way or even help out.

One unfortunate thing about NFL Quaterback Club is that you can only play individual games.



Instead, Fever Pitch offers a fun kick-around, that's really only good for multi-player games. Even then, the only fun thing is the novelty of the special players.

The most disappointing thing about Fever Pitch is the gameplay. The players look good, but







controlling them is awkward (especially when tackling). The screen is too small as well, you only get to see a tiny bit of the pitch and it's impossible to know where your or your opponents players are. An' the rot don't stop there! There's plenty of other niggly bits, like the player with the ball running as fast as someone chasing and the puny crowd SFX.

On the whole Fever Pitch lacks the moves and style of FIFA and ISS and also the strategy and gameplay of Sensi. It's fun purely as a multi player game and even then only because of the special players. S




Nintendo's timing for their latest release couldn't have been better. The sun


is starting to climb higher in the sky, the smell of freshly cut grass hangs

There are some drawbacks, but really when you consider that there isn't another game to touch it on the SNES, then these really fade into insignificance.











32. Go to the left and kill the four water monsters to reveal a door to the dark space where you should save your game once more.





To unleash it, get down the shops, buy a copy of the game and with the help of our tips you'll be raring to go!





When you finally complete all the courses, you'll get the privilege of seeing all the geezer responsible for this fine game. Unfortunately, it's not easy to get there, so we thought we'd help by giving you a little cheat that will take you there at anytime. Okay, it's not exactly gonna help you win, but it's interesting to try. On the main screen hold down the L and R buttons and at the same time press down on the pad and the B button. A newspaper should then appear and after a couple of taps on the keys you'll see the posse responsible.





It soon becomes clear, when you're playing the game, that the more stunts you do the faster you go. The temptation therefore is to try and get in as many as poss every time you hit a bit of straight. But WAIT! If you're not careful you'll only end up flat on your saddle. If this happens you'll lose all your speed and you'll be left standing. The trick then, is knowing where and when it's safe to do all those flashy moves. The key is in the track. You may think it's just a glorious piece of technicolour artwork, but there's actually reason in them there colours. Here's a rough guide:

Red: As usual this colour means danger, well, be careful anyway. As, when you whizz past some red track, it's a safe bet there's something nasty coming up, like a one way section, a tricky jump, or a loop the loop. It's advisable not to jump whenever your on a piece of this track, as it will usually spell disaster and the loss of precious seconds.

: A piece of track in this colour usually means there's a jump up ahead, or the track comes to an end. Don't do a stunt or jump until you know the way's clear. If it is a jump approaching though, get in a big one and do as many stunts as poss. We're not sure what it does for you, but it'll sure as hell look good!

Orange: This is the worst bit of track around as it means there's something nasty afoot. This usually comes in the form of goo an' stuff, so be on your guard. Keep your finger on the jump button and get ready to jump.

Green: Ah! This is the glorious bit. Once you get a whiff of green put your finger on the charge and let rip. You're pretty safe here to do as many stunts and flips as you want and really get that speed building up.

Chequered: Well, it's pretty obvious surely! This means you're approaching the finish and well, that's it!

Each course in *Unirally* has at least one stunt track. The oblect on these tracks is to score as many points as possible. You do this by doing triple flips and so on. 



Companies won't suddenly stop producing 16-bit games just like that. Remember that the SNES and NES existed alongside one another for a good three years before the NES finally took its curtain call.

Dear SG, Firstly, well done on a pukka mag; all those people complaining about the price should stop! I don't mind paying £2.95 as long as I'm paying for quality, which I am.

Now, I've said that, let me get to the real point why I wrote. I've got Zelda (US version). I tried a cheat from your mag which was to see all the tasks in the game by pressing on the title screen: Right, Up, B, A Down, Up, Down, Up and B, but it didn't work. Is this because the game is s US version? Also, on Zelda 3, once you've got all three pendants on the light world, then what do you do? Barry, Epsom

I couldn't try that code out on an American copy (cos we

haven't got one) but yes, it's unlikely that PAL version cheats will on NTSC carts. The games are often tweaked and altered slightly for the different markets either side of the pond.

I'll throw your Zelda query open to the readership. Frankly that's too far back even for me to remember off the top of my head!

Dear SUPER GAMER, I am a newcomer to the SNES (just six weeks), and I have so far bought the following -Alien 3 (bought second-hand), Donkey Kong Country (with SNES), International Superstar Soccer, Mortal Kombat 2. Starwing, Super Mario All Stars, Super Mario Kart, Super Mario World and Super Metroid (bought second-hand).

I think it is quite a good selection. what do you think? But I am lacking shoot-'em-ups, RPG's, strategy and racing games. Could you please tell me, in your opinion, which is the best game of each type? David Saunders, Chippenham

Sounds like a pretty decent lot there ... yep, not bad at all. Shoot-'em-up wise you can't go far wrong with Starwing, or if it's the scrolly kind you're after, what about R-Type III. The RPGs to be seen with are Zelda (1, 2 and 3), Secret of Mana and Illusion of Time. As far as racing games are concerned, you have the best in Super Mario Kart, though Micro Machines is a good larf, as is Dirt Race FX. These are just personal opinions mind you, so don't blame me if you don't like 'em. All I can say is they sure as hell be on my desert island!
