

'tomb raider', she found a way of life, not a profession...



Indiana Jones and the Infernal Machine follows roughly the same story as the PC and N64 versions. Indy's old friend and CIA agent Sophia Hapgood arrives with evidence that a Soviet physicist



called Volodnikov has been searching the site of the Tower of Babel. The Soviets are looking for evidence of an ancient machine that can open the door to a parallel dimension called the Aetherium. Volodnikov and his Communist henchmen are anxiously trying to reassemble the machine, but need to find several crucial parts to get it working. The missing parts, scattered throughout the far corners of the globe, are the targets of Indy's quest.



Unlike the *Tomb Raider*-style action of the other versions, this game seems to follow the *Obi Wan*-style puzzle mode, with blocky but to-scale graphics. With nineteen levels in which Indy must defeat the nasty Ruskies, armed with his faithful whip and four other weapons, plus video sections inbetween levels (not just renders, apparently!) this is bound to be a hit for all those people who like *Time Team* and love car chases. And at least it's out before the much-mooted new Indy movie!

INTERNET

Built-in support for Internet access via a mobile phone. Nintendo intends to provide downloadable software, multiplayer online gaming, chat facilities and email through its proposed Internet service.

COMPATIBILITY

The good news for Game Boy owners is that the Advance is going to be fully backwards compatible will all black and white and colour software.

GAMECUBE

Plug your GBA into a GameCube and use it as a game controller, where the GBA screen will act like a Dreamcast VM unit.

CAMERA

The GBA utilises a digital game peripheral so that gamers will be able to see who they are playing against over the Internet, via a new camera different to the GBC version. You can also expect hugely improved GBC camera and printer options.

ANYTHING ELSES

With the usual two AA batteries supplying 20 hours continuous play, L and R buttons for a wider variety of operations, a PCM Stereo sound generator and a special communication cable for connecting up to four different players, the GBA can also be used for playing games!

With levels based on the recent movie, *Rugrats In Paris* is made up of countless mini-games which you must complete as you explore the

FIRE CLUB MASTER KEN

Fire Master - Ken

FIRE CHARGE DECK

Deck - Fire Charge Deck

Ken the Fire Master uses mainly Fire and Colourless Pokémon in his deck. Ken's main tactic is to stall for a short while, giving him the chance to build up stronger Pokémon on his bench. Cards like Chansey and Kangaskhan will take lots of damage before they are **Master Ken**

knocked
out allowing a few turns to try to
build up a stronger Pokémon with
powerful attacks. Try to defeat the
active Pokémon quickly and use
Energy Removal cards in order to
reduce the energy on the more
powerful cards. With a bit of luck,
the Fire Medal will soon be yours.

Grass Club

Choosing the Charmander and Friends deck will automatically give you a head start against the members of the Grass Club. The three junior members of the club will duel you in four prize



matches but before you can face the club master you'll need to actually find her. If you head outside the club and then up to Ishihara's house you will find Nikki the Club Master learning more about Pokémon.



Grass Master - Nikki

Deck - Flower Power Deck

Nikki uses mainly Grass Pokémon in her deck so any Fire Pokémon will cause major damage, potentially giving you the upper hand. Try to knock out your opponent's Pokémon quickly and make sure that you destroy Exeggutor as soon as you possibly can in order to avoid the Big Explosion attack. Turn up the heat and you will easily win this battle and earn yourself the Grass Medal.

Lightning Club

Before heading to the Lightning Club, you'll want to re-arrange your deck to ensure you are properly prepared. Electric Pokémon are weak against Fighting Pokémon, so make sure you include powerful Pokémon like Hitmonchan and Hitmonlee. Also include other types of Pokémon as Zapdos has resistance against fighting monsters and most of the Electric decks will include this card. Defeat the three junior members of the club and you can then confront the Club Master.



Lightning Master - Isaac

Deck - Zapping Self-destruct Deck Isaac the Lightning Master is keen on using Pokémon like Magneton. who can self-destruct. He also uses colourless Pokémon like Kangaskhan, but these will crumble quickly under attack from Fighting Pokémon. Use your fighters to destroy this deck and make sure that you knock out the destructive Pokémon before they can cause too much damage. Win this duel and you'll receive some Mystery Boosters and the Lightning Medal.

Science Club

The members of the Science Club use lots of different Pokémon types, but most are weak against psychic attacks. Build decks that have several different Pokémon types and include Psychic, Fighting and Fire Pokémon. Use the battles in this club to build up your own deck and try lots of Pokémon combinations to find one that works for you. Defeat the three junior club members and you can then take on Rick the Science Master.

Science Master - Rick

Deck - Wonders of Science Deck

Rick shouldn't cause you too many problems, but you should watch out for his Psychic Pokémon. Use Ghost Pokémon like Ghastly and Haunter, which are not weak against other Psychic Pokémon and also remember to include a few of your own personal favourites. Once you defeat Rick you'll receive two Laboratory Boosters and the Science Medal.



Rock Club

Science Club

Grass Pokémon are the key to defeating the members of the Rock Club that you will be up against. Pokémon like Pinsir and Scyther are great assets to your deck, and you'll need to include a couple of other Pokémon types as well if you are to beat the opponents here. Successfully defeat the three junior members of the Rock Club and you then will get a chance to duel Gene the Rock Master.







Rock Master - Gene

Deck - Rock Crusher Deck

The Rock Master Gene likes to stall for a while using hard Pokémon. utilising this time to build up his bench Pokémon. Try to knock out these stalling cards quickly in order to get Gene's bench Pokémon into play early. Use Scyther to cause lots of damage and make sure that you have plenty of energy in your deck in order to counter any Energy Removal cards that may be used against you. Defeat Gene and you will get two Mystery Boosters and the Rock Medal.







Fighting Club

The Fighting Club is different from all the others, as most of the members are travelling the world. You can find the three junior members of the Fighting Club at different clubs and



only when all three have been defeated can you challenge Mitch the Club Master. To find the junior members check the Rock Club, Grass Club and the Fire Club, and then try your luck against Mitch.



Psychic Club

The members of the Psychic Club will present you with different challenges, as Psychics are only weak against their own kind. The Ghost Pokémon are a great addition to your deck, but you must include Pokémon of other types too if you are to succeed. Once you have beaten the three junior club members, you can then take on Murray the Club Master. The old man waiting in the reception room will also give you a bonus prize if you can beat the Psychic Champion.





Water Club

Most of your opponents here use Water-based Pokémon, so using Grass and Electric Pokémon will work in your favour. The three junior members of the club will give you a good work out, and with less prizes on offer, the games can be over in a few moments. Master Mitch

Fighting Master - Mitch

Deck - First Strike Deck

Psychic Master - Murray

Deck - Strange Psyshock Deck

This can be a very tough battle if you have not got your deck in order. Fighting Pokémon are good for taking out any colourless opponents, and you can also use your Ghost Pokémon to damage any psychic activity. Try to concentrate on any weakness in Murray's deck and use Trainer cards to gain an advantage. Beat Murray and you'll win two Laboratory Boosters and the Psychic Medal.

Use Electric Pokémon to inflict major damage on your opponent and if you're lucky, you'll win this tough battle. For defeating Amy you'll receive two Laboratory Boosters and the Water Medal.

Use Electric Pokémon to knock out Jack's active Pokémon as quickly as you possibly can and make sure you keep an eye out for the Legendary card.




