And it's also bound to cash in on this endless Potter-mania too!



# CRAP! SCRAP! Mortal Kombat Advance

**Torso-rippin'-fight-finishin'-snow-mannin'-head-bangin' KOMBAT... The next level?**

**E**ven in this Advanced new century, the Game Boy (in fact, Nintendo in general) has an undeserved reputation for being nothing but kids' stuff, generating a world of smiley hills, cute pink things and braindead little monsters. This release is bound to do just a bit to dent that squeaky clean image, and hopefully cause a little controversy, just as the original did many years ago.

## To The Death!

Because *Mortal Kombat* (for all its promotion of bad spelling) is the ultimate in violent, dark, gut-wrenching beat-'em-ups, questions have been raised in the house and warnings have

been stamped on the box, but we all just keep yumming it up. Since generating a couple of iffy movies and an even iffier brace of adventures entitled *Mortal Kombat: Mythologies*, the denizens of the Outworld have been a little quiet for late. However, that's soon to change with a whole host of next-generation-console scrappers, and this exciting new handheld translation: the ultimate in portable *Mortal Kombat* action!

As it's basically a pixel-perfect port of *Ultimate Mortal Kombat 3* (with one exception being the absence of four-armed nasty Sheeva) this is going to be one GBA title sure to impress. Every single unmissable

Fatality and Friendship is in place, allowing you to either take pity on your foe, rip their lungs out, or turn them into a snowman. It's always been this range of options and the many hidden moves that have made *Mortal Kombat* such a must-have game over the years.

## Finish It!

Luckily, we can all rest assured that this version will boasts full two-player link-up options (although it's still not certain whether this will be available with just the one cart) and the remaining 24 fighters are all in place. The graphics look superb for a handheld fighting game, and we just can't wait to start scrapping away with the link-up. Only a couple of months to go now until that croaky-voiced man says those immortal words: 'FIGHT!'

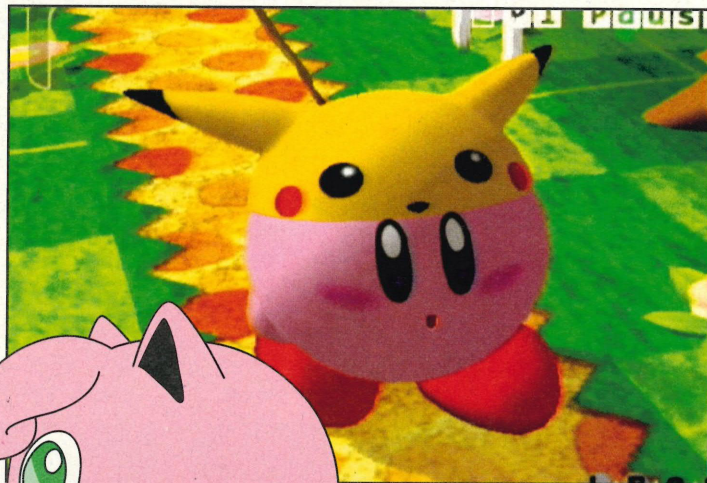
## What's this Super Smash Bros all about then?

It was two years ago that Nintendo released its multiplayer fighting game, *Super Smash Brothers*, onto the N64. Now the whole



gang is back for the biggest scrap ever on the GameCube! Obviously Mario is there, as are Yoshi and Princess Peach. So too is Star Fox favourite Fox McCloud, and even Samus from the *Metroid* games gets to do a bit of blasting. However, Pokémon fans will be on the lookout for everyone's favourite Pokémon, Pikachu, who is there along with Jigglypuff, Mewtwo and Pichu for company, all ready to duke it out with Ninty's finest. Only Pikachu is selectable from the start, though – as with other secret characters, including Ganondorf, Luigi and Young Link, you'll have to complete various parts of the game to unlock the other Pokémon. There are even rumblings that it may link-up somehow with *Mario Advance 2* (hence the new shots!) but we'll have to see...

One of the best things about the game is the way that you use power-ups to help you to win the battles, including a vicious Poké-ball. If you can manage to grab one before your opponents get to it (or it just disappears) you will unleash a little Pokémon onto your opponents – including, Cyndaquil, Venusaur, Blastoise, Bellossom, Chikorita, Togepi, Wobbuffet, Chancey, Suicune, Moltres, Zapdos, Articuno and Unowns – if only for a little while...



Each character has their own special bonuses. Samus and Fox have guns, Jigglypuff can fly and Pikachu has a lightning attack. However, we rather like Kirby! He has the ability to eat his opponent and then starts to look and act like them. It's really cool when Kirby swallows Pikachu – check out the shot and you'll see what we mean! Is this a new Pokémon? Pikaby or Kirbachu? Any which way, this is an amazing celebration of everything that Nintendo stands for – fun, fun and FUN! And a little bit of violence. Bet you can't wait...

We're still to see the full extent to which using the GBA as a GameCube controller opens up these amazing new games, but we do have an official list of all the GameCube games that will be able to interact with Game Boy Advance titles...

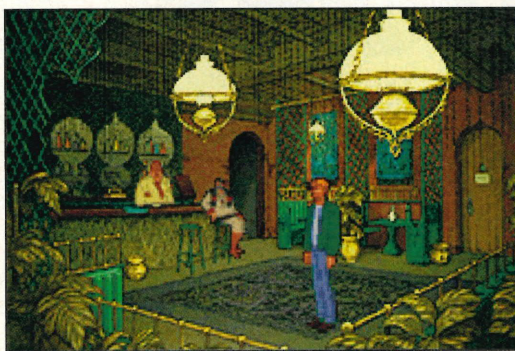

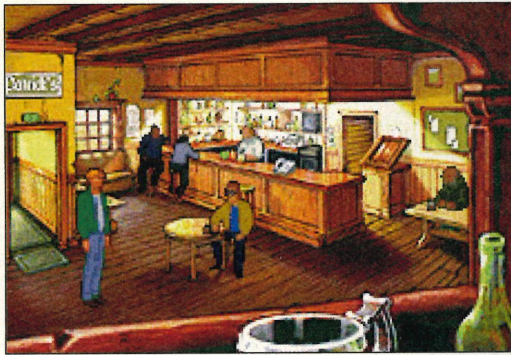
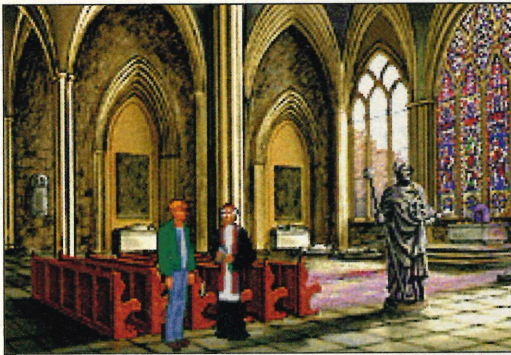

Still, the PlayStation version sold well and this GBA conversion looks pretty darn amazing. And so it should - it's coming from bam! Who has proved in the past that it knows how to put together a satisfying GBA package.

If these magnificent shots leave you a little in the dark, it may be worth knowing that the action of the game follows 'George Stobbard and Nico as they team up to thwart the cataclysmic climax to a conspiracy that has run through the centuries'. So it's not a comedy then.

But who cares, you can tell from even a brief play of the existing code that this is an amazingly close conversion, and will stretch the GBA's capabilities to the max, which is more than you can say for most Advance



titles so far. The original music (by Inspector Morse composer Barrington Pheloung) is in place, and the action, dialogue and challenges will ape the PlayStation and PC versions extremely closely. Adults of all ages should be counting the days for this one.



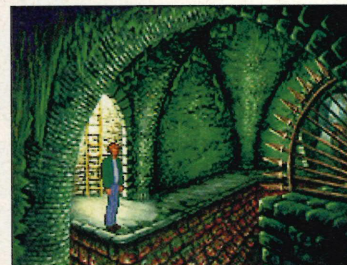
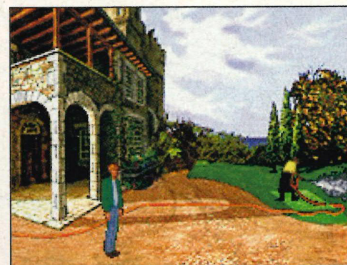

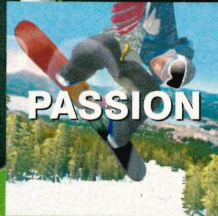


## More Japanese craziness - and we have the shots!

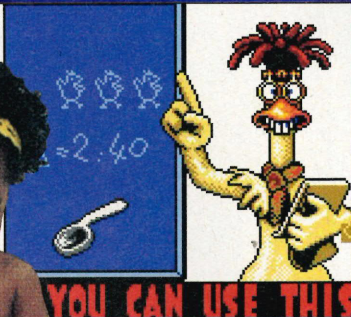
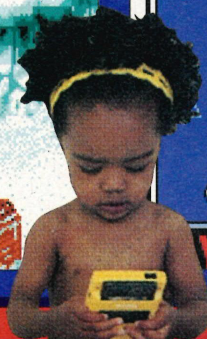
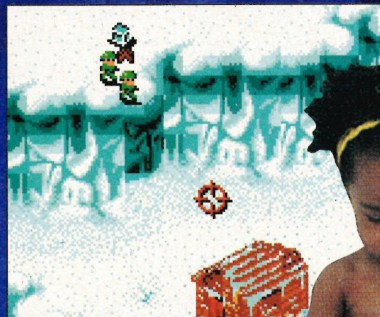
# A Year In

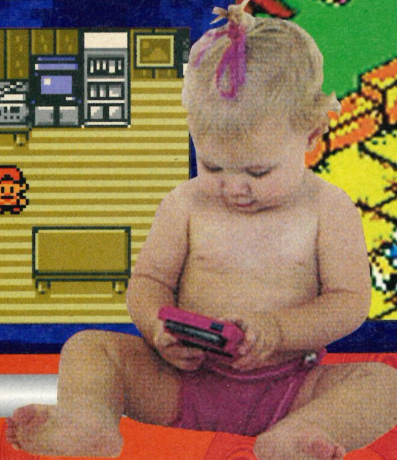
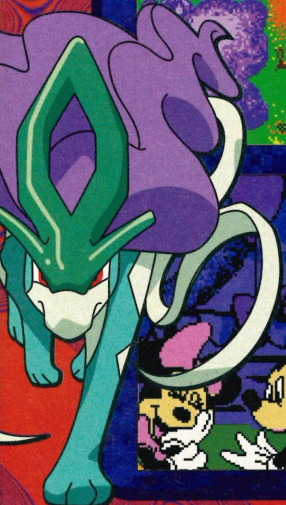

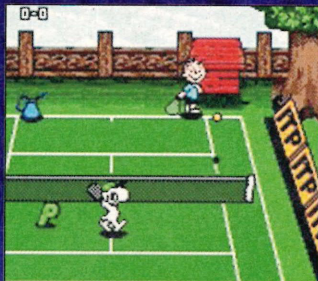

## Fourth Quarter

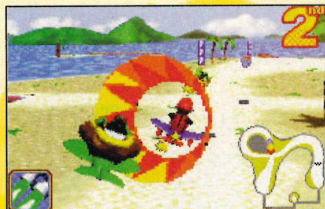

## We Want More!

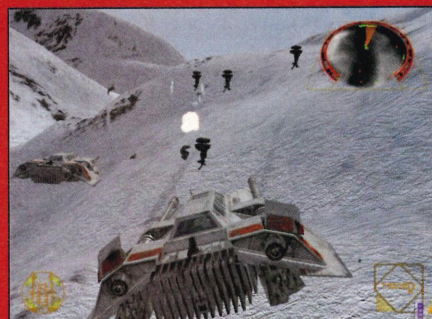

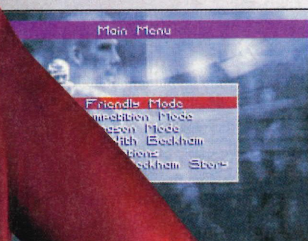


# David Beckham Soccer

He's the best footballer this country has produced since Best - but can his game cut it on the GBA?

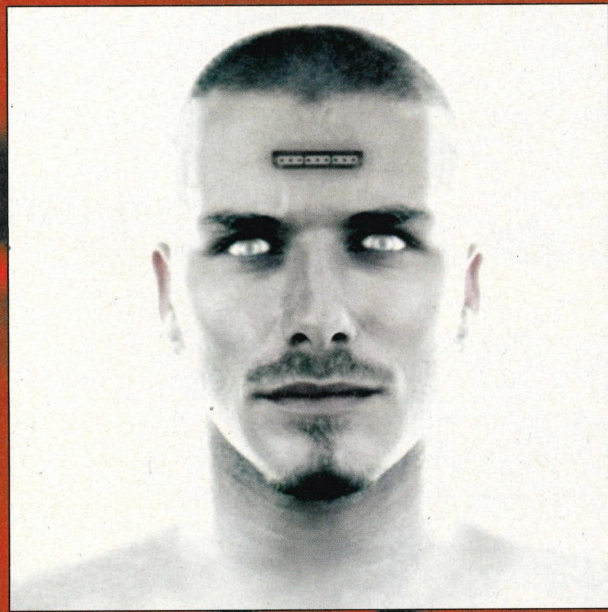


**Y**es, finally we have the chance to carry the country's greatest footballer around in our pockets - but the question is, should we really bother?



## Becks Ain't Human!

The adverts put together by Rage to plug their footy game are brilliant. Our boy David is scanned and a new version is recreated - a mutant Beckham with a Joypad port in his head. Rumours that Victoria didn't noticed the difference have been fabricated for the sake of a good joke.



David Beckham Soccer is a welcome addition to the footy market, which has been dominated by just two giants, International Superstar Soccer and FIFA. Rage's brilliant arcade-style kick about should change all that, as this really is a fast and highly addictive football extravaganza!

## Good Shot

David Beckham Soccer has a top-down view that is similar in style to the classic Kick-Off games of the Eighties, although the players are more detailed here and you'll need more skill in order to get those goals. Luckily, the game features an extensive Training mode, where you can learn exactly how to pull off the best free kicks etc, etc - so playing through this should prepare you for the huge number of modes in the main game. Whether you want to play a single kick about game or trawl through a whole competition, David Beckham Soccer has it all.

## On Target

The graphics are very clear and colourful, and the GBA screen allows you to see a considerable amount of the pitch at any one time - and so you can plan all those fancy moves that you learnt during your training!

Add to all this The David Beckham Story (which gives you all the info on the great man himself) and you have a brilliant arcade/sports title that certainly deserves a place in your GBA.

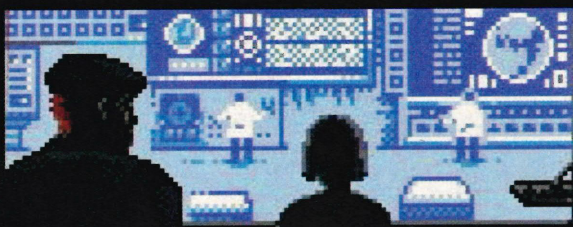
It seems like donkeys' years since Capcom announced it was bringing *Resident Evil* to our beloved GBC. Anyway, after a massive wait we can finally indulge in some zombie-mashing action on our favourite handheld. First things first, if you're expecting a direct port of any of the previous *Res Evil* games then you'll be in for a bit of disappointment. You see, this is an entirely new adventure, designed especially for the GBC. You control Barry Burton (Bazza appeared in the original PSone *Resident Evil*) a hard as nails special agent who has been called in to investigate some mysterious goings on, on a pleasure cruiser called 'The Starlight'.

Once on board, it doesn't take long before you work out that something has gone horribly wrong. The crew of the ship and the passengers have all been transformed into flesh hungry members of the undead.

The root of the problem can be traced back to the B.O.W. (Bio Organic Weapon), it's your job to destroy the B.O.W., cleanse the ship of zombies and rescue any survivors. The action is viewed from a forced overhead perspective and involves exploring the ship, solving puzzles and (of course) blasting the zombies back to hell.

### Monster Mash!

The combat system is really well designed, basically you target any bad guys on the screen and then your view switches to a first-person view. Here you can see the zombie(s) up close. At the bottom of the screen is a line with a

It's a classic tale of good vs evil, set in a land of magical kingdoms and dragons.

**Turn, Turn, Turn...**  
You may think that being released so close to the new *Zelda* series is a bad thing, but to be honest the two games

really are completely different. *Zelda Oracle Of Ages/Seasons* has real-time combat - you run around and slash at your opponent. *Breath Of Fire* has turn-based battle (like *Final Fantasy*), which means that when you get into a fight, you have to take turns with your enemy. Each successive battle will earn you experience points, and over time you will become more powerful and you will learn plenty of new techniques and magic attacks.

# Planet Of The Apes

This game sneaked out onto the shelves without much fuss, which begs the question: why wasn't it plugged a bit more? What's wrong with it? Actually, this cart contains quite a lot of surprises – and not all of them bad...

## They Did It!

Firstly, it doesn't seem to be based on the recent Tim Burton movie at all, the scene being set by misty illustrations that places the original crash (that strands the hero on an

unrecognisable planet peopled by upright primates) firmly in 1973. The game also has an eerie seriousness about it, more in line with the original French novel than any TV or movie version of *Planet Of The Apes*. However, there's a lot here that simply can't be taken seriously. The monkeys that amble amiably right and left waiting for you to shoot them never fail to raise a snigger, whereas the stupid password system and awful music are more likely to simply annoy you.

## They Actually Did It, The Baskets!

What's also interesting is whether the game designers paid the creators of *Prince Of Persia* or not, as this side-scrolling platformer is practically identical to the Amiga classic. The main character animation is almost pixel perfect to *Prince of Persia*, with realistic hanging from cliffs, crouching, inching and, of course, falling to your death on pikes. But then *POP* has many fans, and there's no denying the interesting gameplay in *POTA*. Fans of the franchise may be disappointed, but anyone who wants to see a realistic, classic-style platformer on the GBA may get a lot out of the challenges here, if they can make out the tiny graphics.

# Harry Potter™ And The Philosopher's Stone

The brainchild of acclaimed author J K Rowling, the young wizard so far has four fantastic books to his name, plus a very, VERY successful film, and now a whole four games, one of which is this very disappointing RPG for the GBA...

### Lumos!

Based closely on the story of the first novel, *The Philosopher's Stone* allows players to step into the young hero's shoes, don his robes and enrol in the

first year at Hogwarts. The objective, not surprisingly, is to reach the end of the first year, three terms on, and defeat (whisper it) You-Know-Who. Players must learn crucial spells and perform a succession of mini-challenges (29 in total) to advance through the game, ranging from negotiating the Forbidden Forest to collecting potions for Snape, exploring Hogwarts after dark, chasing down nasty-piece-of-work Malfoy to collect Neville Longbottom's Remembrall and engaging in a fast-paced, top-down game of Quidditch.

### Happy As Harry

Along the way, over twenty (wow – twenty?) familiar characters will pop up to help or hinder Harry, and Potter devotees will certainly find that it remains faithful to the book. Hogwarts itself is impressively expansive too, despite the fact that there are no secrets here. You simply have to do what you're told. Which is pretty much what you did on the last level.

Tiny tots on the hunt for a challenge may find plenty to get their teeth into, as the various objectives are often irritatingly tough... (try avoiding prefects in the dark on an already-dim GBA screen!) Also, the required tasks can get disturbingly repetitive – even the most studious apprentice may be



disheartened at the prospect of pushing around blocks, stunning goblins or casting spells on bushes when they have to do so again and again!

This isn't going to stop Harry's followers from enjoying what's on offer, though, and with a bit of Potter-esque perseverance, they'll be well on their way to beating Voldemort (oops, sorry!) making this a predictable hit, no matter what the quality of the gameplay.

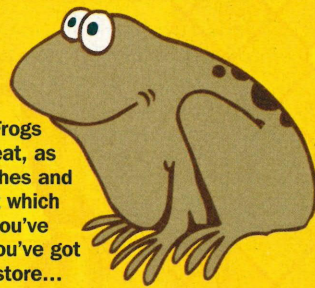

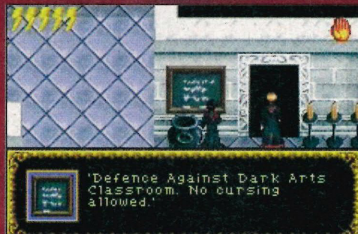

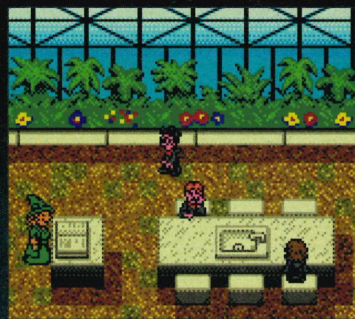

# Harry Potter™ And The Philosopher's Stone

**There's this kid, you see, with a lightening scar on his head and... oh, you've heard it?**



I was glad to do it. Boy, wait until I tell the guys I helped Harry Potter!

Let's be honest, for the vast majority of you, reviewing any Harry Potter™ product is about as pointless as publishing a book entitled *How To Breathe*. But you've got to be warned, before it's too late: this game is a massive annoyance. We already warned you that it was basically just a complete *Pokémon* rip-off, but it's actually more annoying than any *Pokémon* game, and at least they had a few secrets hidden away.

### It's A Kinda Magic

The problem with the GBC version of Harry's adventures is that they've aped the *Pokémon* games while keeping the strict plot of the book, which means you don't have half the freedom to explore or plan strategies like you had in Johto. Instead of collecting monsters with different moves, Harry simply plods around Hogwarts slowly picking up new spells to use in battles against rats, bats and the like, thus collecting experience and becoming a stronger wizard. They've even half-inched the whole Elite Four concept for the end, thanks to the long drawn-out final battle with You-Know-Who. It gets extremely difficult, as the challenges

are vague and you often end up facing an adversary without any chance to go and collect much-needed bonuses (imagine facing the Elite Four without a few potions) or having no idea where you are, thanks to the darkened blocky graphics?! Can you then explain to us how we just completed the game in 13 hours without hardly a break?

### Potter-Chu!

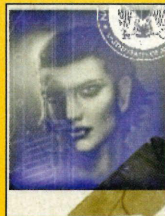
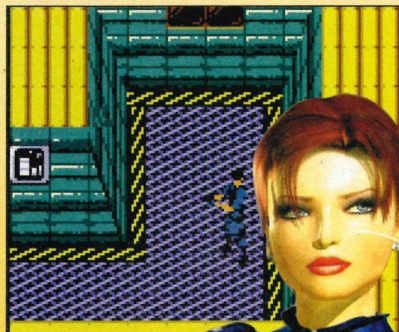
Dear TGB,

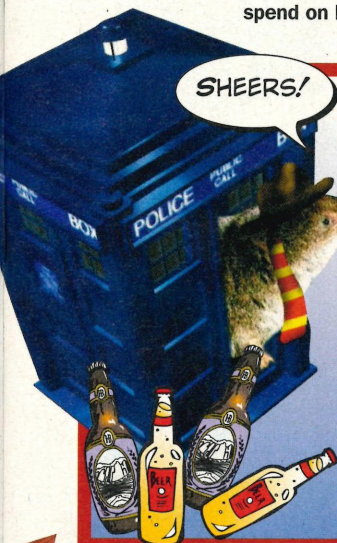

# Ecks Vs Sever Walkthrough

## ECKS Missions 1-4



### MISSION 1

**Location:** Warehouse

**Objectives:**  
Locate the room with the laptop

**Y**ou start out in the streets. Head towards the recessed doorway down in the far right corner. Shoot the guard and pick up the Keycard. This opens the warehouse door behind him.

You are now in the first warehouse. To your right are a couple of shipping crates and a stack of boxes. Directly ahead is another stack of boxes and a couple of barrels, behind which is an Armour pick-up. Crouch down when passing the boxes on your right otherwise the guards in the main area of the room will shoot you. Now head back towards the door you initially came through. There is a gap in the boxes between the crates that you can shoot through and pick off some of the guards – aim for the exploding barrels for maximum damage. To the right of the blue crate is a gap allowing you to creep behind the crates – follow this to the end wall, taking the opportunity along the way to pick off more guards in the central area through the gaps in the crates. At the end of this path is a grille at ground level. Crouch down and shoot

this out, then crawl through the air vent, picking up some more armour. Shoot out the grille at the other end and take out the other guards, using the exploding barrels to your advantage. One of the guards has a Colt – make sure you pick this up. There should be lots of ammo to collect after you have dealt with all the enemies. Head towards the door by the blue crate on your right – but watch out for the guards hiding behind the crates though!

The next room contains four crates, two on either side. Shoot the guard at the far end of the room, and then creep around the back of the crates on the right hand side. There is another guard between them. Shoot him from behind and steal his colt.

Before you open the door to the next room, make sure your gun is fully loaded, and stand to the left hand side – there are a lot of guards behind the door waiting for you! Shoot out the barrels first of all. If you are taking too much damage nip to the side, let the door close and then try again. Once you've dealt with them collect the pick-ups, head up the stairs going up on the right and through the door on the left.

There is another rising staircase on your right. There are three guards waiting along this staircase and in the corridor. The corridor turns right and then left with a doorway on the right.

Shoot down the guard at the end of corridor on the left and then turn 180

degrees and enter the room on the right. Take out the three guards. Leave this room through the door you entered it and then enter the room on the left. The guards here drop more ammo for your colt so be sure to pick it up.

Follow the corridor round, being careful not to fall down into the warehouse area where you originally started. At the end of the corridor is the Monitor Room, housing three Feds and the laptop. Mow them down and retrieve the Laptop to finish the level.

### MISSION 2

**Location:** Warehouse

**Objectives:** The Bomb is activated.  
Escape within 3 minutes.

**T**he thing to remember in this level is that speed is of the essence – taking out all the enemies isn't essential.

Go round the street area to the right; pick off the guard by the warehouse entrance door and grabbing the Pancor.

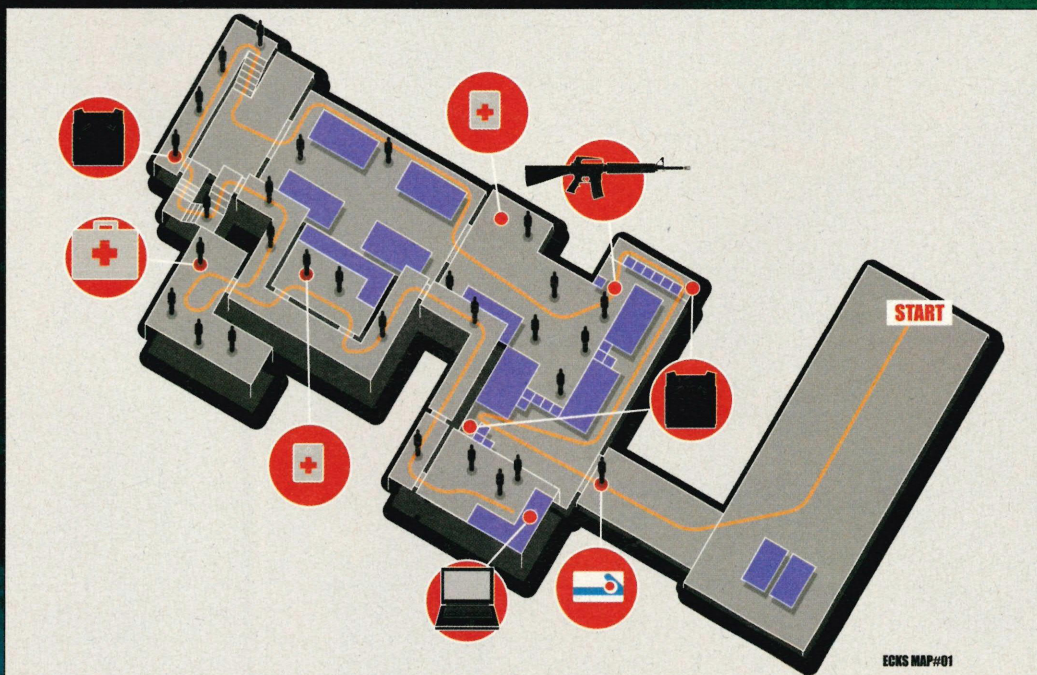
Shoot the guards at the end of the room and between the stacks of boxes on the left. The guard on the left drops some Pancor ammo that you can retrieve by shooting the barrel between the box stacks, which is blocking a gap you can crawl through.

Instead of heading through the door at the end of the room, you can turn right when you first enter and go up the small staircase, climbing through the air vent at the end of the alley. Watch out for the guard at the end though. This way you avoid the second room all together, bringing you out on top of a shelf of boxes in the third room.

If you prefer to rush through the second room there are guards hiding between the crates on the left and right.

In the third room you can either run round the crates on the left, or crawl through the gap in the shelves of boxes on the right. There are guards hiding between the crates on the other side of the stack of boxes, and another Fed guarding the door on the right.

In the next room there are two guards standing on either side of the



lift and one hiding behind the boxes in the left hand corner – deal with the two by the lift first and then take out the other.

There is a secret route in the next room that allows you to pick up the colt and avoid encountering too many enemies: Immediately upon entering the room, turn left and head towards the left hand corner – you will notice that the floor is a slightly different colour in the gap between the wall and the boxes. Stand on this and you will be raised to the top of the boxes – from here you can run along and “jump” across the stacks, picking up the colt and ammo. Jump down and head for the next door.

Make sure you’ve got your colt out and get blasting – the exit is at the end of this room – don’t stick around to pick everyone off, just make a beeline for the door and slide under it!

### MISSION 3

**Location: The Streets**

**Objectives:**

**Shoot Sever dead.**

**Rendezvous with Mills and get Deciphering Key 1.**

In this level you have to shoot Sever through the large windows. There are four points in total and at each window you have to shoot her one more time than at the previous one. Upon shooting her the required number of times she will run off to the next point, the next wave of enemies will blow up the barricade that is blocking your progress.

Pick up the sniper rifle and ammo on the boxes. Peek around the corner – you should just be able to see Sever through the large window. Bring up the sight and shoot Sever once. She will run off down the corridor. Edge round and use the sniper rifle again to take out the enemies in the alley, shoot the barrel to kill the guard hiding behind the dumper.

Run through the covered alley, edge around the corner and shoot Sever twice. Be careful of

the guard hiding in the covered alley to the left. There’s another guard hiding behind the dumper. Use the sniper rifle to pick off the guards and feds, and make sure to grab the Pancor and armour pickups.

The next area is too narrow to use the sniper rifle effectively without taking serious damage from Sever’s grenades, so after using it to take out the lurking fed switch to the pancor – strafe behind the boxes and shoot it out with her. Make sure you don’t end up on the right hand side when the barricade blows.

Go through the covered alley. As you round the corner you can see the next window. Keep your distance, bring up the sniper sight and you can easily pick off Sever. There are two guards in the courtyard directly ahead, but be careful as you round the corner as there are a group of feds chucking grenades and taking potshots out of a window on the right: hold back, and take out the guards first whilst covered, then round the corner and quickly use your sniper rifle to shoot the barrels directly under the window. This should take out most of them. The rest can be picked off quite easily.

Follow the alley, taking out the feds, ensuring you pick up the Colt.

In the next open area you will see Sever crouched by Mills – shooting her will cause her to drop the deciphering key and run off down the alleyway – pick this up and follow her

### MISSION 4

**Location: The Streets**

**Objectives: Follow Sever. Don’t lose her.**

This level is divided into a series of streets and indoor sections. You start off outside with Sever right in front of you. Begin chasing her and she will make her getaway. There is a guard behind the dumpster on the left as you round the corner, and two others beyond the crates on the right. Make

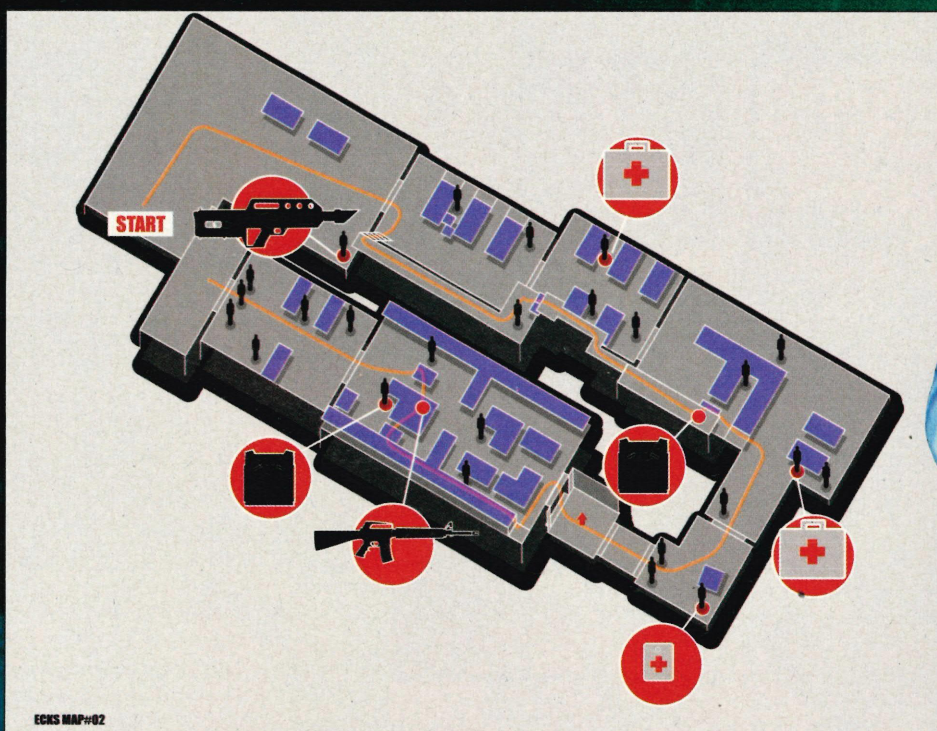
sure you pick up the Pancor from one of these guards.

Enter the first building, dropping the guard standing in the doorway. Run up the stairs – there’s another guard at the top of the flight. Enter the room at the top shooting another guard – he’s holding some more ammo for your Pancor. Open the window, blast the guard on the fire escape, and make your way to the next window. Be careful when opening it, as there is another guard on the other side, this time equipped with a Colt.

Follow the stairs down and back outside, where you should catch up with Sever again. Mow down the guard standing in the corner and head for the covered alley – watch out, there’s a SWAT goon hiding in there so keep your finger on the trigger. Keep your eye on Sever and follow her into the next building. You start running into FBI agents at this point so try and be a bit more precise with the shooting. Enter the next building, head up the stairs, shoot the Fed and jump through the window.

A guard is hiding around the corner on the fire escape – strafe and mow him down. This guard is holding a rather handy Ingram. Keep on shooting and you will also take out the SWAT member standing down the other end. Open the window on your right, pick off the guard in the room and collect some more Ingram ammo. Clamber back out and make your way down to the far window, picking up the Armour that the SWAT dropped.

From now on you will be encountering lots of SWAT goons so make sure you’ve switched to the Ingram. There are two of them directly in the room behind the window. Make your way down the stairs, dealing with the men in the corridor. Watch out for the guard hiding behind the door in the next room. Run down the corridor and catch up with Sever out side. Watch your back for the SWAT hiding in the covered alley in the right hand corner. Follow the road after Sever, picking off the SWAT. Enter the Viper Lounge to finish.



# SEVER Missions 1-4

## MISSION 1

**Location:** Warehouse

**Objectives:** Locate the room with the laptop

**W**alk down the corridor. Pick off the Guard in the first room. In the next room at the end of the corridor there are three guards, but first waste the one just to the right and grab the Pancor - use this to take out the others and pick up the armour.

The guard before the stairs has a health pack. Go down the stairs and get ready to lay into the four guards in the room at the bottom. There's some more health to pick up here. Open the warehouse door, shoot the guard at the end and then creep behind the crates to surprise the two guards waiting in ambush between the boxes. Make sure you are standing on the left of the next-door facing right so that you have a direct shot on the guard standing in the corner as soon as the door opens.

There's a secret vent just to the left of the door that holds some Pancor shells. Move through the main warehouse area using the exploding barrels to maximum advantage. Head right and climb up the pile of boxes in the corner. Turn left and enter the monitor room where three FBI agents are protecting the laptop - pick it up to finish the level.

## MISSION 2

**Location:** Warehouse

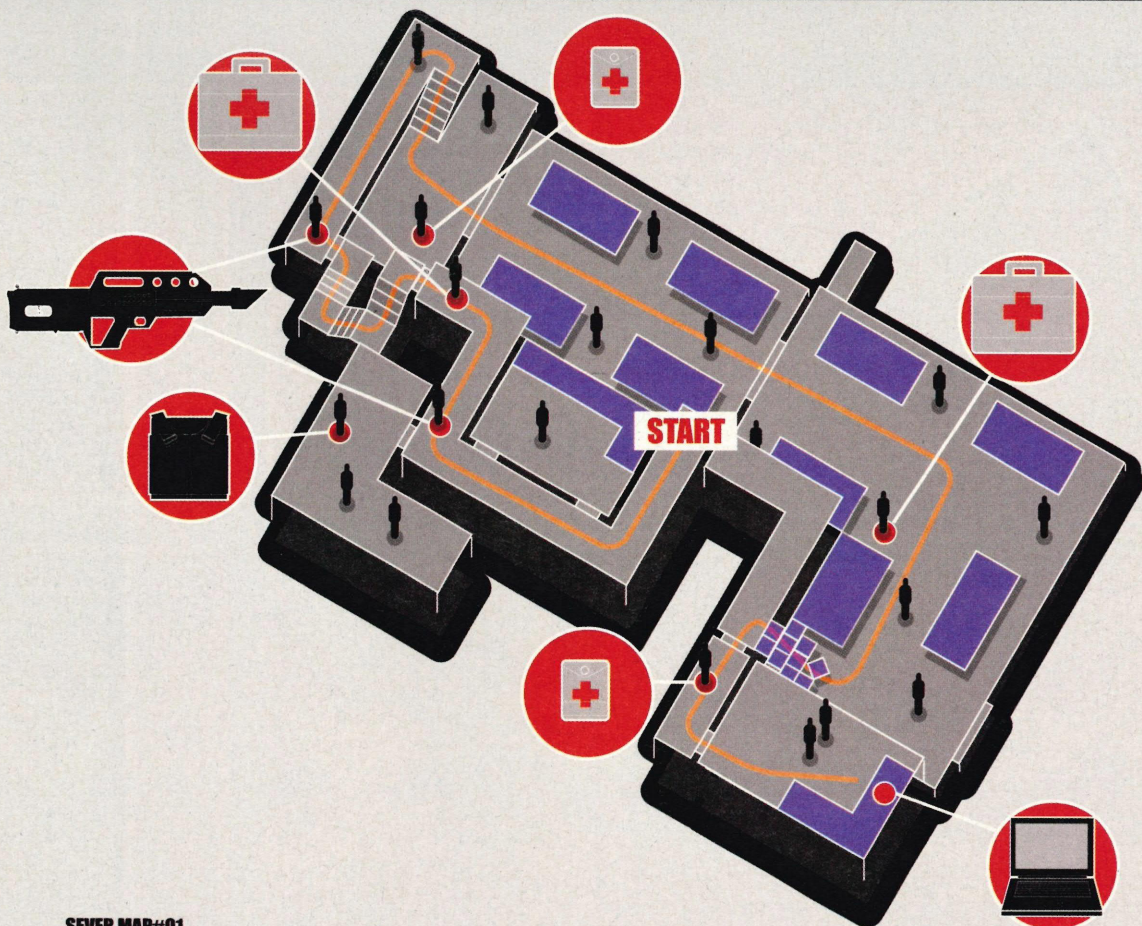
**Objectives:** The bomb is activated - escape within 3 minutes

**R**emember, speed is of the essence on this level; don't waste time needlessly trying to shoot all the enemies.

Head towards the half-open warehouse door, shooting the guard hiding behind the boxes to the left. In the first room there is a guard hiding behind each of the shipping crates. The first one on the left has a Pancor, so take him out and grab his gun. The second one on the left is holding a health pickup.

The next room is a bit of a maze - the best way to navigate it is to stay to the right until you reach the barrels in the middle blocking your path. Blow them up and head straight for the door at the far end. If you have some time to waste you could collect the Colt and ammo on top of the boxes by heading to the far right corner and standing on the light square between the boxes and the wall.

Go through the door and activate the lift. It takes a little while to come up so don't be worried if nothing seems to be happening - you should be able to hear it coming up. Watch you back for any FBI agents that you missed. Take the lift down - in the room at the

bottom are two guards by the door and one hiding behind the stack of boxes.

Go into the next area, creep around the crates on the right, shoot the FBI agent in the back and then make a beeline for the gap in the crates straight ahead. Pop a cap in the guard on the other side before jumping out. Notice the light square on the floor? It's another secret lift! To activate it, action the boxes opposite it and then step back. This allows you access to the vent so you can get bypass the next room. Drop of the other side; shoot the barrels at the other end, hopefully catching the FBI agent at the other end of the corridor in the blast. You needn't worry about the other enemies in this room unless you are running low on health, in which case there's a health pack up for grabs. Otherwise take the door on the left back outside.

Run round to the left, blow away the guard and FBI agent, and then dive under the open warehouse door to finish.

### MISSION 3

**Location: The Streets**

**Objectives: Locate Encrypted Disk 1. Find Mills and kill him**

**Y**ou start in a covered alley. Enter the building – be ready for the guard immediately on your left. Head down the corridor, making sure you pick up the armour dropped by one of the guards.

As you enter the first room, crouch down and shoot the two guards. Ecks is outside trying to snipe at you, so keep your head down until you pick up the grenades that the goons drop.

Creep up to the window and chuck a grenade out – you only need to hit Ecks once to make him move on to the next window.

Carry on along the corridor, lobbing grenades around the corners to blast the waiting guards. You can pick up some armour and extra grenades in the next room, and even more grenades plus some health in the following corridor.

Be careful when entering the next room as the door is directly facing the window – Ecks will take every opportunity to destroy you. The best tactic is to try and lure the Guard and FBI agent towards the door and then throw a grenade in. There is another guard just inside the door to the left of the window: make sure you shoot him before crouching and moving towards the window so that you can start lobbing grenades out with suffering further damage. You will need to hit Ecks twice this time though.

Take the corridor through the door on the left. But watch out as you round the corner as you are in direct line of the window. There is another FBI/Guard pair in the room that can easily be dispatched with a well-placed grenade.

Tucked away through the door on the left is a cowardly FBI agent. Grenade him and grab the health pickup before chucking grenades at Ecks, now requiring three hits. Head down the corridor on the other side of the barricaded alley. In the next main room the window is directly to the right of the door so be careful when taking out the FBI agents on the far side.

Run through the last room picking off the remaining agents and then head into the courtyard where Mills is waiting. Use the Colt to assassinate him and pick up the keycard before heading out for the half open metal door.

### MISSION 4

**Location: The Streets**

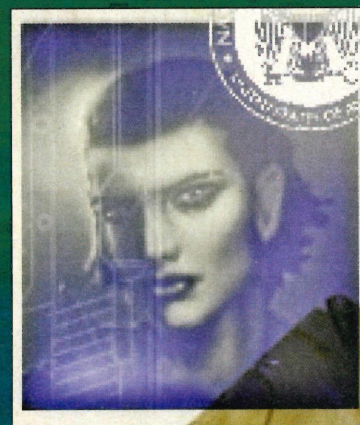
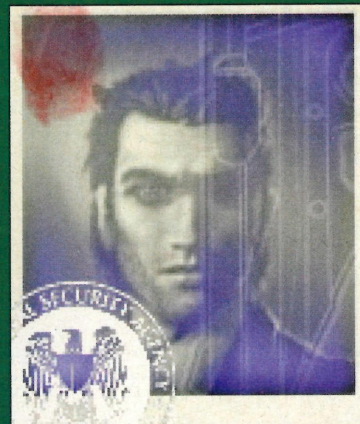
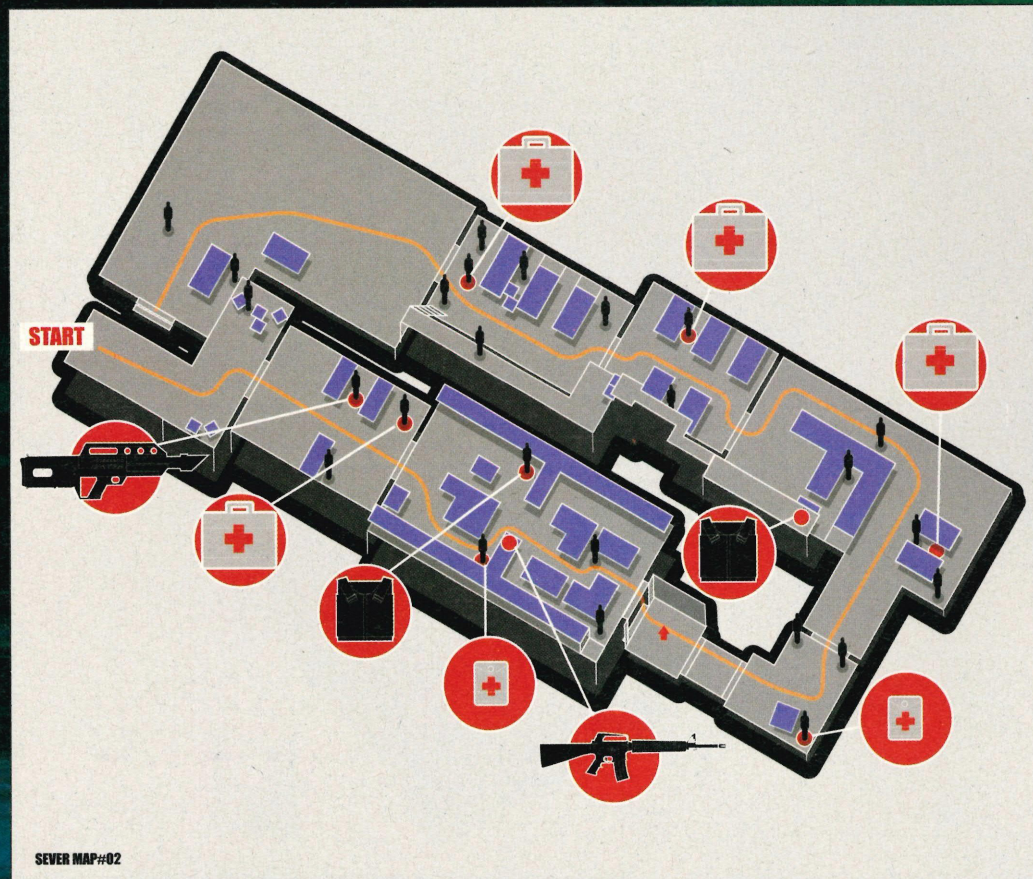
**Objectives: Ecks is in pursuit. Try to evade him.**

**T**he key to this level is not to stop and take Ecks on. He's a mean mother and will kick your ass. Just stay out of his way as much as possible. This is another mission where you are better off just making a run for it and not worrying too much if you miss a few kills.

You start behind some boxes: use these cover and head for the next set on the left. As you turn the corner you will run into a guard. Put a cap in him and nick his Pancor.

The entrance to the building is around the corner and through the door on the right. Pick up the armour in the next room – you are going to need it! Move down the corridor and through the window, dropping guards where you can. Through the next window along is a guard holding a medi-kit if you're running short on health. Follow the fire escape to the left and grab the Colt of the guard through the next room.

Avoid using the Colt straight away, as you will need it to deal with the SWAT members later on. Exit the building and follow the street round to the right. Enter the door to the next building and shoot the SWAT on the left, thanking him for his Ingram as he hits the deck. Then it's through the corridors and onto the fire escape, back through the window and down more corridors. SWAT will be firing at you all along the way – do your best to ignore them and keep running. Exit the building and you're on the final straight. Follow the road around and enter the Viper Lounge to complete the mission.

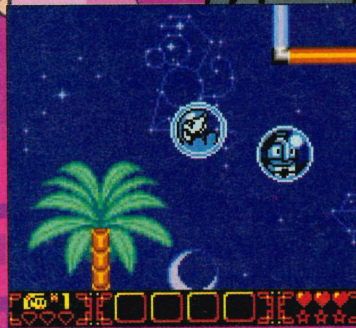
### Kooky

The game contains a selection of different play modes, although the main bulk of the action sees Luke blasting



his way through some really cool, brightly coloured Wild West environments. Unfortunately, you have only got a limited supply of ammo, so try not to waste any shots as you pick off the various bad guys that pop up throughout each stage.

## Gone West

It's all good fun, but the slightly simplistic gameplay may soon leave older gamers a bit bored. Fortunately, to spice things up, there's a whole bunch of mini-games that can be played against the computer or with a friend via a two-player link-up option. There are definitely better games on the GBA, but *Lucky Luke: Wanted!* will keep younger players happy till the cows come home. This certainly isn't essential, but it's worth a look.

**P**oor old Kao. This dear kangaroo hasn't fared too well on any console so far. Since his first appearance, all of his adventures have been instantly slated as unoriginal and, far worse, uninspiring. And, having played the brand-new Game Boy Advance adventure, this seems to be because the designers of the inane puglist marsupial don't have an original idea

in their heads. From the very first set of spikes to the final boss level, *Kao The Kangaroo* comprises 21 levels of platform clichés.

**Kao Knock Out?**  
Of course, this means that a certain amount of people who have an insane attachment to moving platforms, bonus mushrooms and cute animals with a great talent for jumping around will still want to add this frankly dull adventure to their collection, so let's give a little credit where a little credit's due. One addition to the standard fare here is the chance to collect keys before

finding a magical keyhole, which gives access to a special bonus level. Come to think of it, that's not as original as we thought.

**Moribund Marsupial**  
There are also a few breaks from side-scrolling boredom, with a snowboarding level, an insane spin in a spaceship and a surfing level. But they're simply not fun! Like practically everything else in the game, they're either irritatingly tricky or bemusingly simple. This game's idea of a challenge is to pit you against an opponent that refuses to be hit, as is clearly visible from the boss levels. The ways of killing each boss are completely obvious, but as each hit they take causes half a millimetre of damage to their massive energy bars, it's a long and boring process to get to the next level. You could just not bother, though, and instead spend a few minutes guessing the irritating passcode to the next level. In fact, that would probably be more entertaining. All in all, this is the kind of game that gives platformers a bad name. No effort has made to introduce advanced features, link-up options or anything. The tunes are rubbish, the idea is tedious and the price is colossal. Let's hope this kangaroo will now hang up his gloves.
